ON Saturday (May 24) two former City financiers will set off on a 1,000-mile unsupported bicycle ride from Land's End to John O'Groats in aid of the Heritage of London Trust (HOLT), which gives grants for specific restoration work on historic buildings and monuments. Robin Key and his wife, Liz Harwood, have worked in the City for 20 years. 'We love London and want to put something back,' said Mr
