HARROW Heritage Trust held an opening evening to show off the borough's historical buildings and parks and promote the work it and others do to preserve them.

More than 130 guests attended the event, held at the Zoroastrian Centre in Alexandra Avenue, South Harrow, a restored art deco cinema that was highly com-

mended in the trust's biennial architecture awards.

Trust chairman Martin Verden said: "Heritage is our business, and the purpose of this meeting is to show what is being done in Harrow as well as getting a broader brush of the heritage world outside.
